

How to Create a Class Team

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To create a class competition and keep track of your students' progress on Transcribathon, it is recommended that you create one or several class team/s. By following these easy steps, you can create a fully-interactive team page to use in the classroom. On the other side of this handout, you can find an example of a class team.

Step 1: Make sure that you and all of your students have created an account on Transcribathon (this is explained in the student handout 'How to Use the Website').

Step 2: Once logged in, hover your mouse over your username in the top-right corner and click '**Profile**'. On the menu under your profile picture, click '**Teams & Runs**'.


Step 3: On the right, click on the '**Create a Team**' button and a form will appear. Fill in a team title, an abbreviation, and a short description of your class.

Step 4: It is recommended that you make the team **private**, so that you can control who can join. You can do this by clicking the '**create/refresh**' button next to the code field to generate an access code. Click '**Create Team**'.

Step 5: You can access your new team under '**Your Teams**' on the left side. Click on the pen icon to make changes.

Step 6: An editing window will appear. Using this window, there are two different ways to add your students to your new class team:

- a) Share the access code in class. Your team access code will always be available to view in the edit window. Students must then go to the '**Teams & Runs**' section on their own profiles and enter the code under '**Join a team by code**'.
- b) Send each student individual e-mail invitations by searching and selecting their usernames under '**E-mail invitation**'. Click '**Send invitation**'. Students are joined to the team once they click the '**Accept invitation**' button on the email they received. If someone didn't receive an email, please ask them to check their spam folder.

Step 7: Once everyone has joined, your class team is now complete. You and your students can access the **team page** at any time by clicking on  next to the team name under '**Your Teams**'. On the reverse side, you can see an example of what you might find on a team page. Good luck and have fun transcribing with your students!
